A New School Year!

Just a few reminders to make it safe, sweet and wonderful...

- Extra Clothes please send in an extra set of clothes (tags labeled with your child's initials). Also rain gear and rubber boots for that upcoming Oregon weather.
- **Emergency packs** please be sure to send your child in with a gallon-size Ziploc bag full of nutritious, non-perishable food by the end of the first full week of school.
