

One thing I forgot to say to all the folks who attended our New Parent Orientation is that drop-off and pick-up time is not a good time for families to communicate with us about anything other than the immediate needs of their child. If you talk to us about a volunteer task, paperwork, financial matters or the like, we will appear to listen politely, but it will be in one ear and out the other. We really have our hands and minds full at that time of day. It would be better to send an e-mail or leave a voice mail. Also, let's bring those extra clothes in immediately. We had a potty accident on the very first day and more will occur. The children keep their clothes in individual bins in the Sunflower Room. For those of you who do not know what goes where, it is as follows: Extra clothes and water bottles in the classroom, coats and boots on the pegs in the hallway, lunchboxes on the floor below each child's coathook. If you hand over the clothes and water bottles at the door, we will show your child where to put them. Another habit that both parents and staff need to cultivate is signing children out when they leave at the end of the

day. There will be a clipboard in a wall pocket just inside the classroom. At 12:00 and 3:00 dismissal, the assistant will sign the students out. For all children leaving at any other time, the parent must sign them out with their initials and the time of day. Don't worry, we will remind you as we all get used to this new procedure.
